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Introduction

More now than in the past, low-income families are on the move throughout the United States. In a time where residential mobility rates for higher-income families are approaching record lows, low-income families continue to remain on the move. One of the issues facing communities, scholars, and practitioners is how to make sense of this mobility, both as a phenomenon in and of itself and also in relation to the communities which it impacts.

This data guide serves as a starting point for more detailed exploration of these issues. By consolidating information from a wide variety of sources, this guide serves as a beginning point for more targeted exploration of mobility within the context of community. One of the primary barriers to understanding mobility in context is that data often lags far behind what communities experience as part of everyday life. This data resource seeks, whenever possible, to consolidate the most up-to-date community data that is available. This compendium is designed to allow users to look up information about every county in Illinois, and simultaneously provides an index that compares county-level attributes with the state as a whole.

As such, this guide allows users to “connect the dots” by examining where low-income assisted households are moving in relation to the local attributes of each community. This guide is in no means meant to be a source of causal information, but is meant to serve as an exploratory resource and jumping-off point.

Assisted Housing Mobility

While current data resources make it extremely difficult to answer the question of where low-income households are moving to and from in Illinois, it is more feasible to examine the subpopulation of low-income households who make moves with Federal housing assistance. The Federal Housing Choice Voucher Program (HCVP) is currently the largest low-income housing program in the nation, serving more than 2 million households annually, and more than 70,000 households in Illinois. The HCVP, sometimes referred to as tenant-based Section 8 housing, provides participating low-income households with the ability to rent a market-rate unit on the private rental market with a subsidy to make the unit affordable to their income level. Tenants in the HCVP pay 30% of their gross income in rent, with federal dollars subsidizing the difference between the tenant’s rent payment and the market value of renting the unit. As such, landlords who rent to HCVP tenants receive two payments monthly - one from the tenant and one from the local housing authority which administers the program on behalf of HUD.

Unlike most other assisted housing programs including public housing, Project-Based Section 8, and Low Income Housing Tax Credits, Housing Choice Vouchers (HCVs) are transportable with the tenant. As such, a participating voucher household can move locally or nationally with their voucher. This unique ability to “port” in between housing authority jurisdictions with a housing voucher serves as the basis for the low-income housing mobility data presented in this document. This document provides basic information on the county-level assisted housing landscape, reporting the number of public housing, project-based, and housing voucher units present within a given county. A separate analysis for each county provides information on assisted housing mobility and the number of voucher households who have moved in and out of each county using their HCV.

Community Context

In addition to county-level data on assisted housing mobility, this guide also presents information on the local community context within which this mobility occurs. Following the initial page of demographic and assisted housing information for each county is a county level index that reports on a number of key community indicators reflecting issues such as housing, racial and economic segregation, labor force, community health, environmental health, crime, and human capital. These indicators are designed to serve as waypoints for the beginning of more targeted exploration of community demographics and dynamics. In addition to reporting the respective value for each indicator, indicators are scored in relation to state averages. Negative scores on the index indicate values that are less desirable in relation to the state average, and positive score indicate values that are more desirable in relation to the state average.¹ The index also presents an average score across all indicators. This index is meant to provide some basic context for the understanding of community-level opportunity, particularly as it relates to opportunity throughout the state of Illinois as a whole.

¹ Index scores were calculated by finding the standardized score for each county with respect to the state average. Scores were ranked as follows: -3: $< -2.5 \sigma^2$, -2: $-2.5 \sigma^2$ to $-1.5 \sigma^2$, -1: $-1.5 \sigma^2$ to $-0.5 \sigma^2$, 0: $-0.5 \sigma^2$ to $0.5 \sigma^2$, 1: $0.5 \sigma^2$ to $1.5 \sigma^2$, 2: $1.5 \sigma^2$ to $2.5 \sigma^2$, 3: $> 2.5 \sigma^2$.

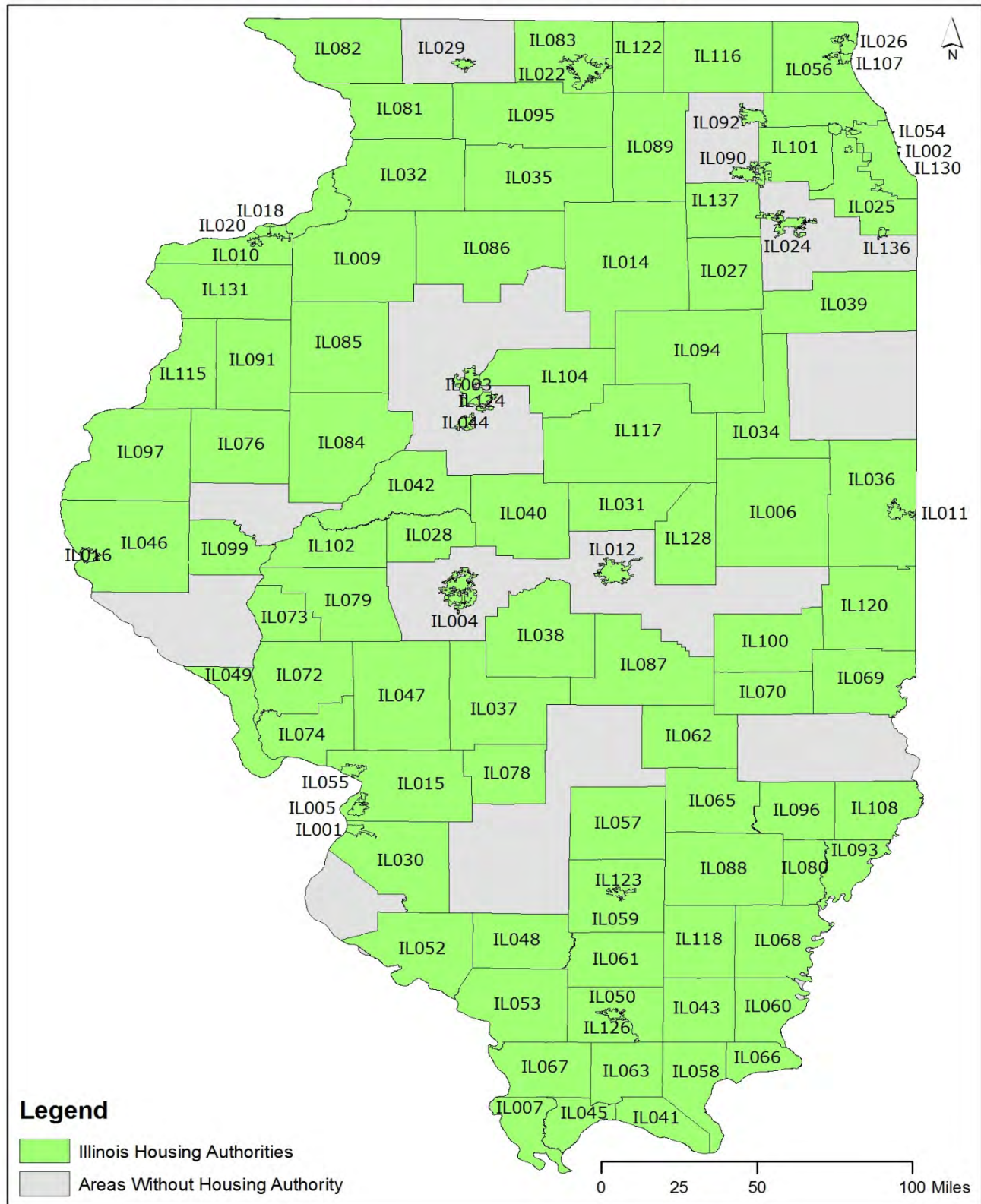

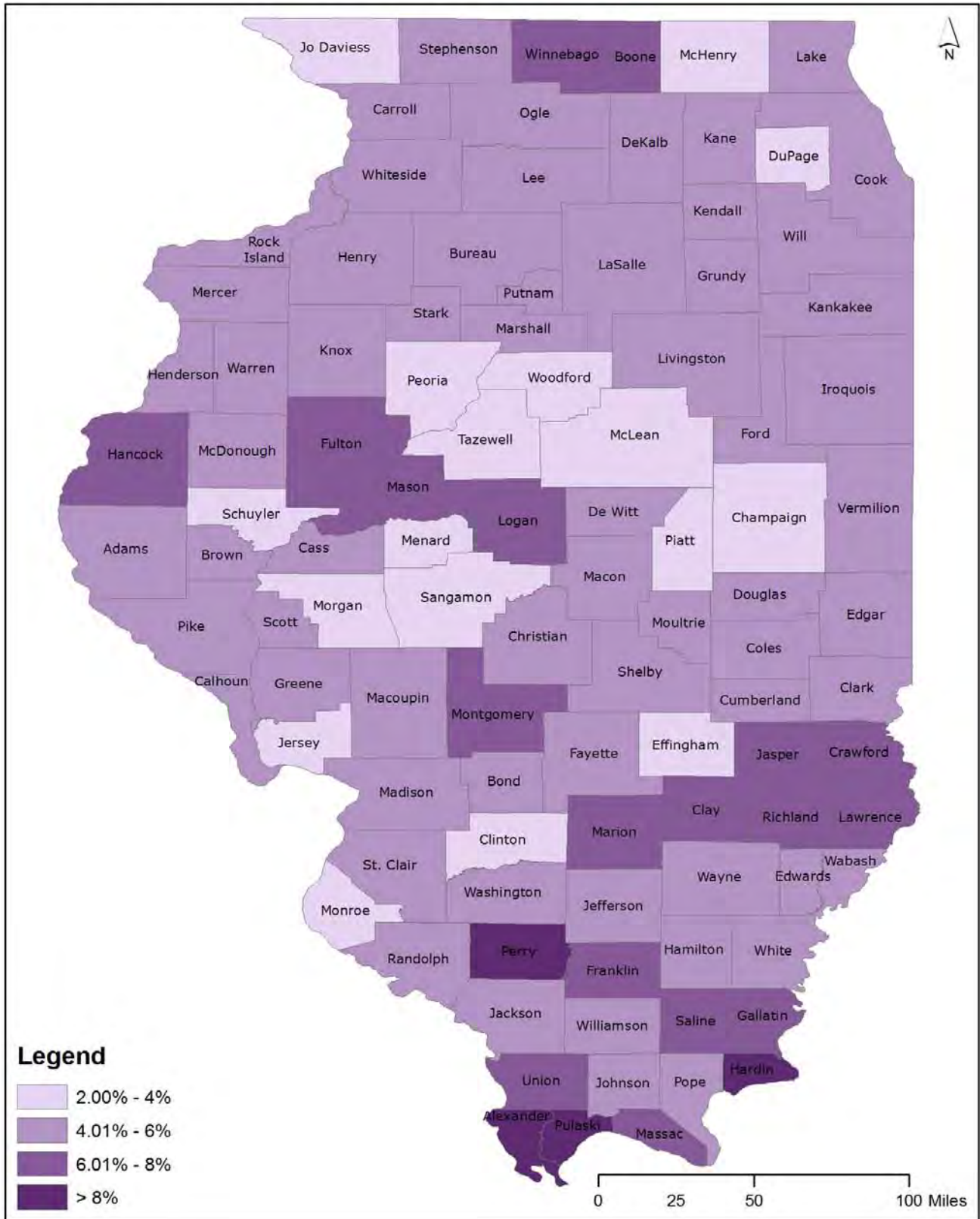

Illinois Public Housing Authorities (2010)



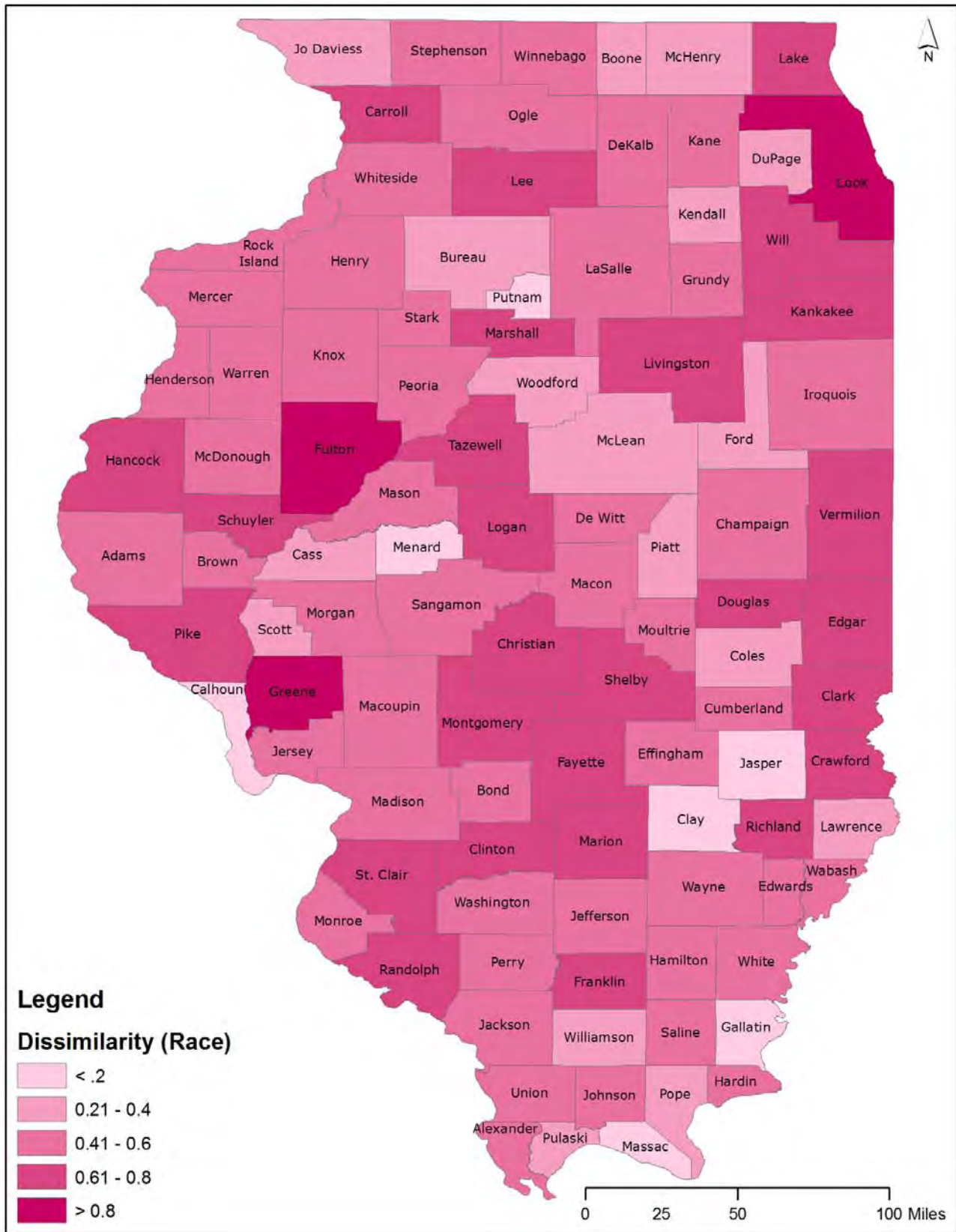

Residential Foreclosure Rate (2008)



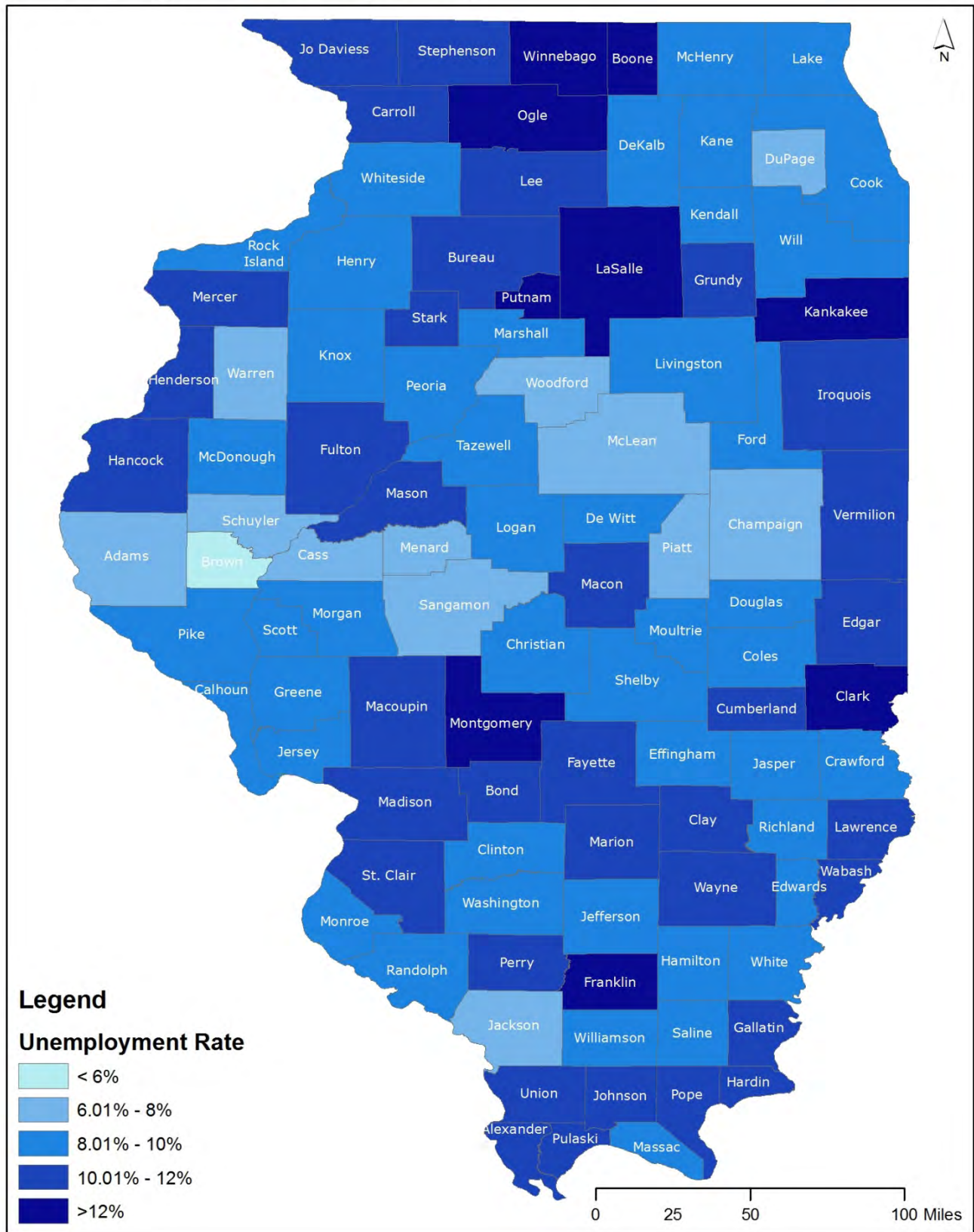

Index of Dissimilarity: Race (2000)



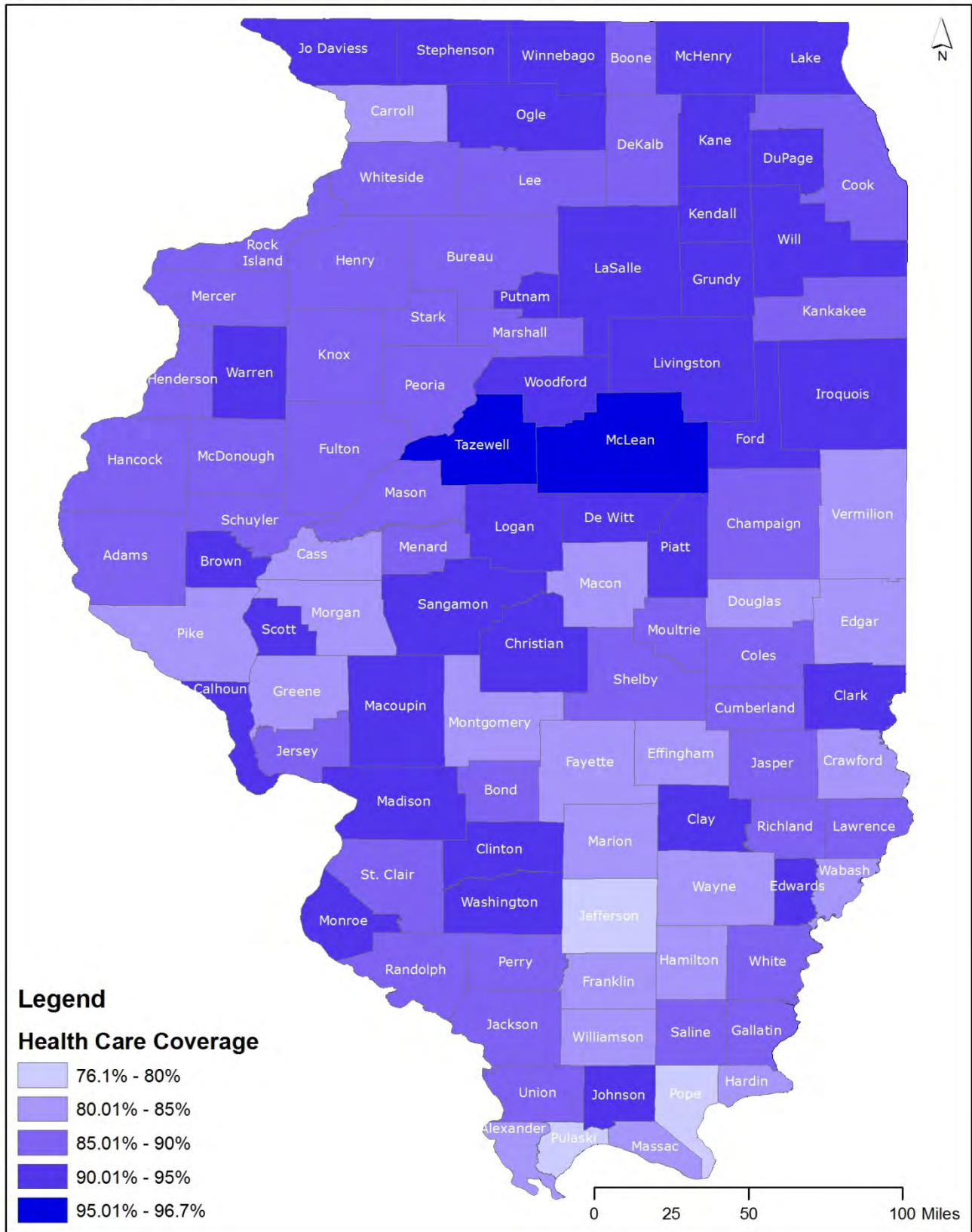

Unemployment Rate (2010)



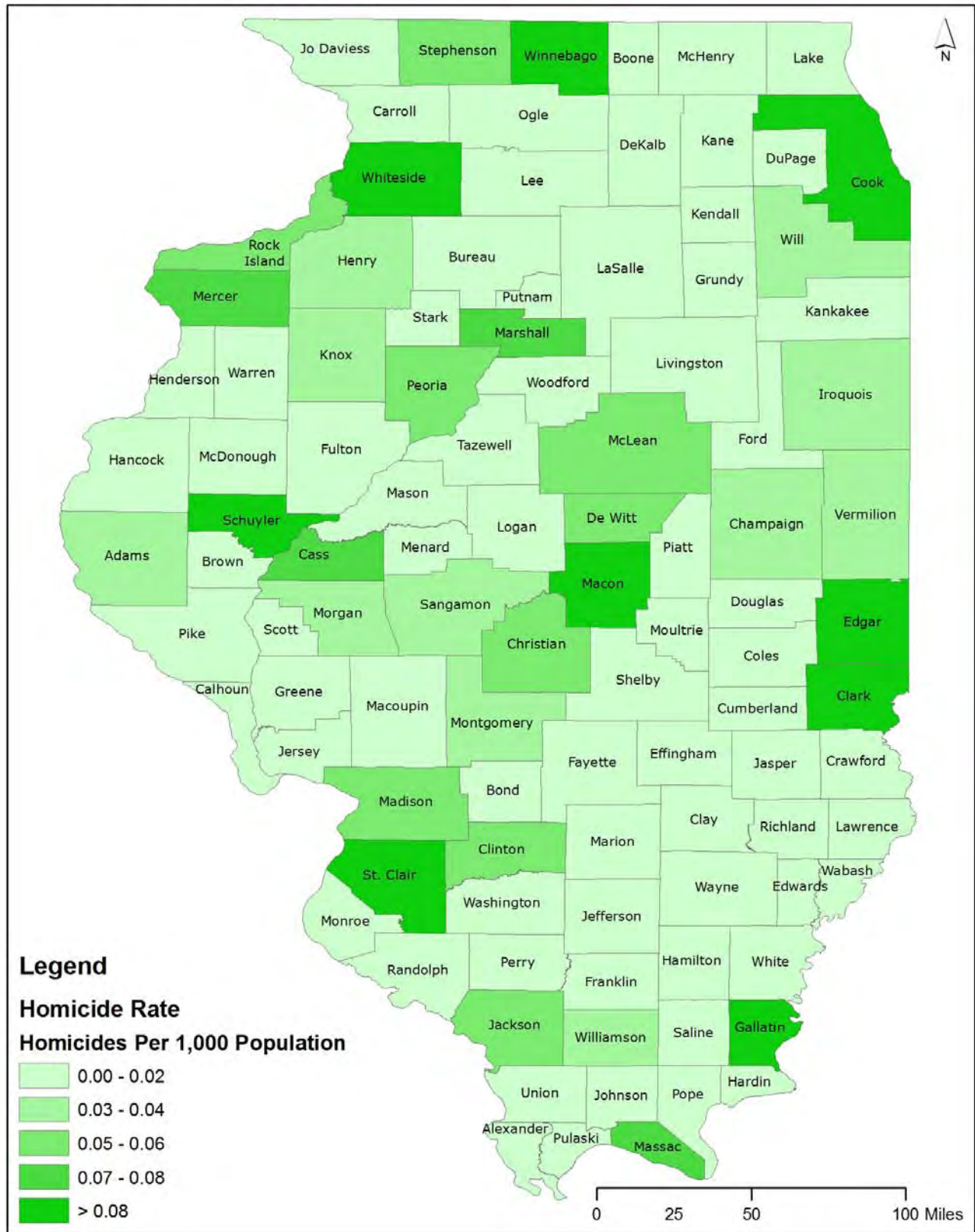
Map 6

Adults with Health Care Coverage (2009)



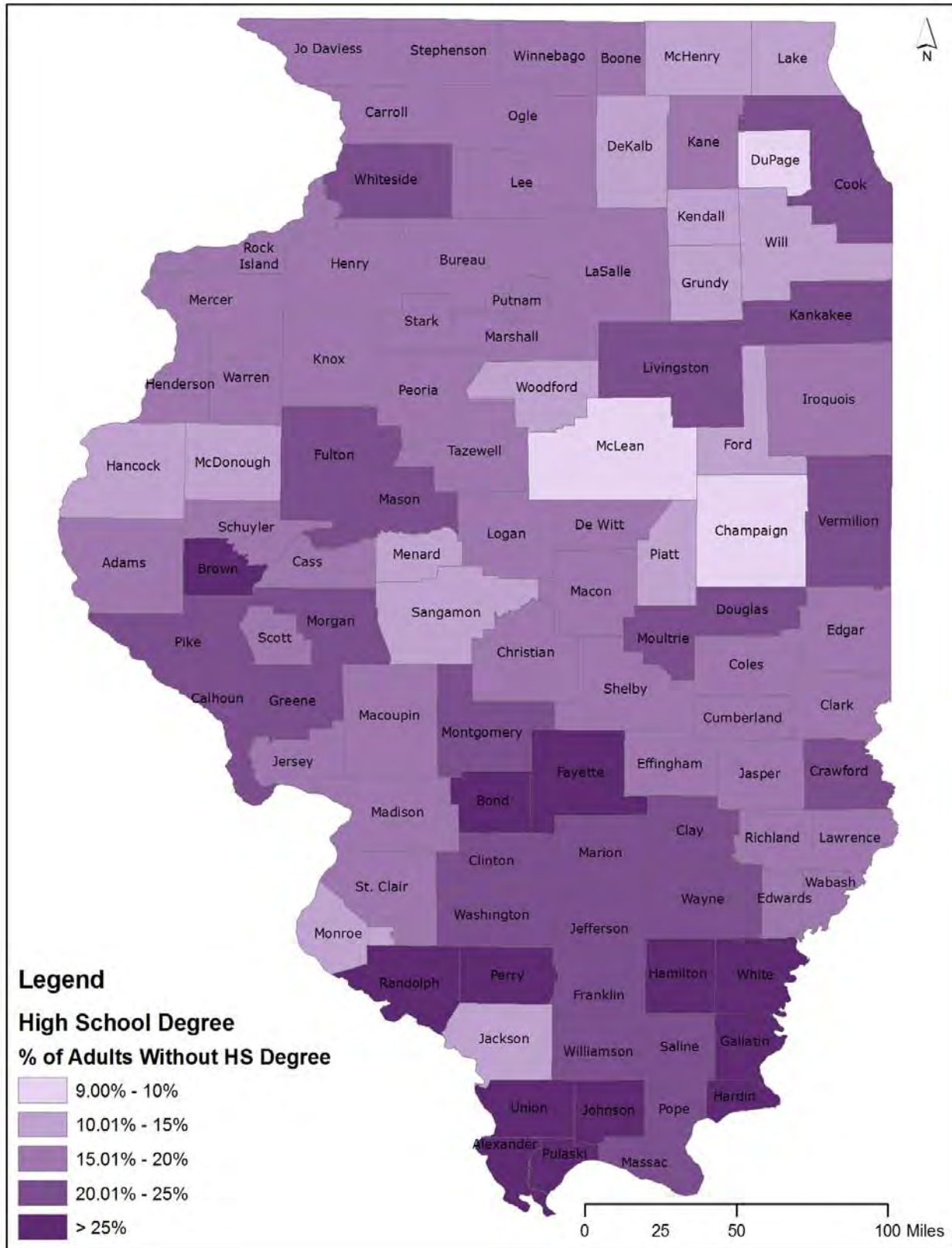

Homicide Rate (2008)



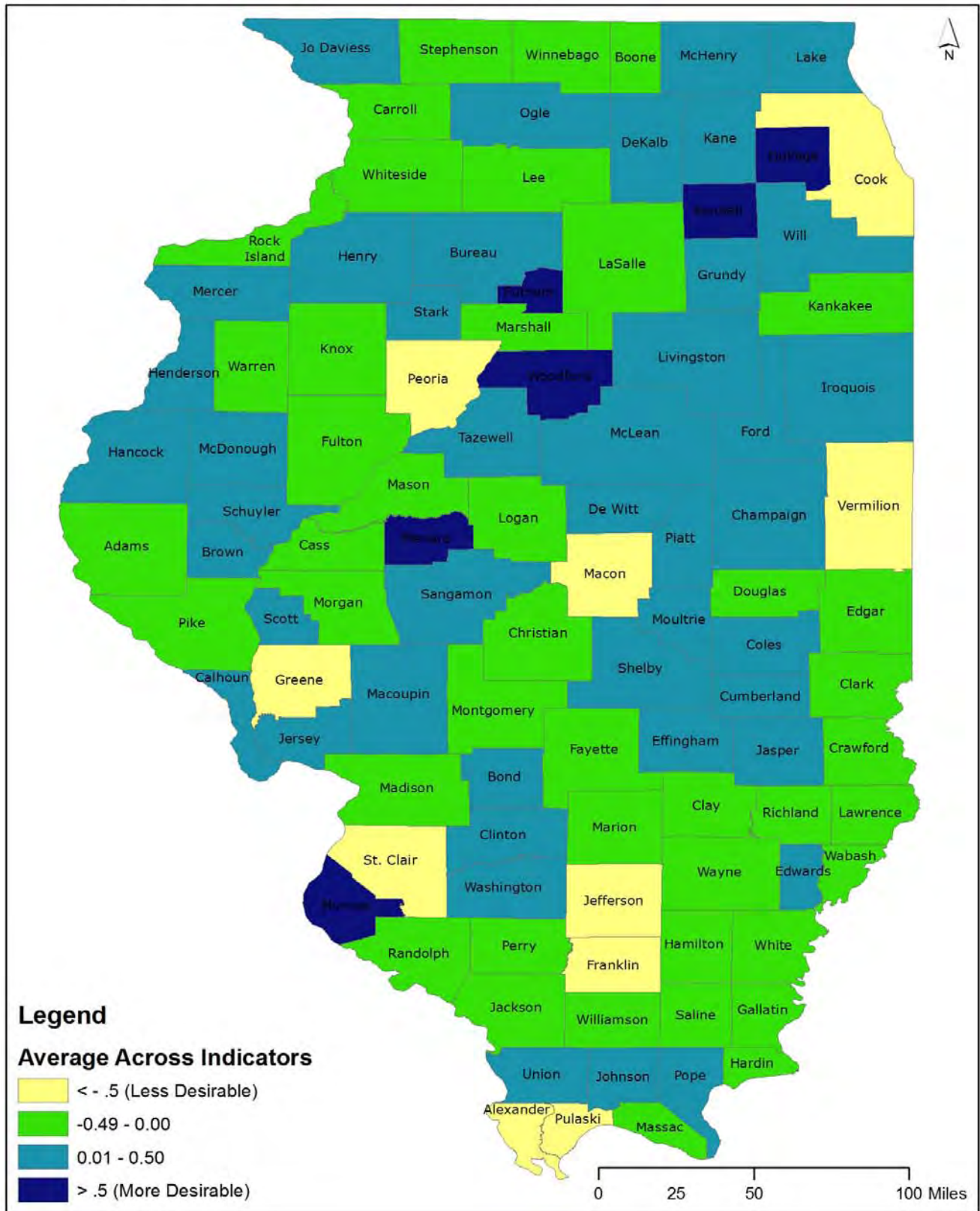

Demographic Data

Data Description:

Demographic data was sourced primarily from the 2006-2008 American Community Survey (ACS). The ACS is a national survey sampling from the general population on an annual basis. Conceptually, the ACS will serve as a replacement for the decennial Census and will provide detailed demographic data covering the entire United States. For some less populous counties, ACS data is not currently available. For those Illinois counties where 2006-2008 ACS data was unavailable, 2000 Decennial Census data is reported.

Demographic Data Reported

- Total Population:** The total population for the county
- Males / Females:** The proportion of the population reporting their gender as male or female
- Median Age:** The median age of the population
- % Under 5:** The percent of males and females in the population that were under the age of five at the time of enumeration.
- % Over 18:** The percent of males and females in the population that were over the age of 18 at the time of enumeration.
- % over 65:** The percent of males and females in the population that were over the age if 65 at the time of enumeration.
- Race:** The number and proportion of the population reporting themselves as belonging to a specific racial identity.
- Latino:** The number and proportion of the population reporting latino ethnicity.

Assisted Housing Program

Data Description:

The number of assisted households as of April, 2010 participating in a given assisted housing program. Public Housing assisted households represent a count of those individuals living in Public Housing Authority owned units. Housing Choice Voucher assisted households represent a count of households participating in the Housing Choice Voucher Program (tenant-based Section 8) who receive a voucher-based rental subsidy to rent housing on the private market. Project-based Section 8 assisted households represent those households living in units that have a subsidized rent attached to the unit. Unlike tenant-based vouchers which stay with the tenant when they move, project-based vouchers are tied to the housing unit itself, and stay with the unit when a tenant leaves. Other HUD-Assisted Housing households assisted represent those households participating in other HUD assisted housing programs such as the Section 8 Mod Rehab and Section 8 Mod Rehab SRO programs.

Housing Choice Voucher Program History

Data Description:

The Federal Housing Choice Voucher is currently the nation's largest low-income housing program serving more than 2 million households nationwide on an annual basis. Housing Choice Vouchers (sometimes referred to as tenant-based Section 8 housing) allow low-income households to rent units on the private rental market. The Federal Housing Choice Voucher works by subsidizing the difference between an affordable share of the low-income tenant's income (typically 30%) and the cost of renting the unit to a market-rate tenant. Unlike Public Housing and Project-Based Section 8 units, vouchers move with the tenant, both locally and nationally, provided that a local Public Housing Authority has the ability to administer the voucher. Moves in between housing authority jurisdictions are called Portability Moves. The data reported in this fact book indicate the cumulative number of portability moves in and out of each county for the years 2000-2007. Also reported are the cumulative number of households participating in each county's Housing Choice Voucher program between 2000 and 2007.

Foreclosure Rate

Data Description:

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Neighborhood Stabilization Program maintains estimates of local foreclosure rates in order to help local governments to acquire and redevelop foreclosed properties that might otherwise become sources of abandonment and blight within their communities. HUD utilizes data from the Mortgage Bankers National Delinquency Survey as a basis to model the number of foreclosure starts at a local level for the time period January 2007 through June 2008.

High Cost Loan Rate

Data Description:

The High Cost Loan Rate provides a proxy for predatory lending activity. The High Cost Loan Rate reflects the estimated number of conventional loans made between 2004 and 2006 where the loan rate spread exceeded 3 percentage points above the Treasury security of comparable maturity.

Residential Vacancy Rate

Data Description:

The residential vacancy rate reflects the number of housing units that are vacant. The vacancy rate serves as one indicator that can provide insight into the "health" of a local housing market. Vacancy rates can reflect not only the amount of turnover being experienced locally, but can also help fill in the picture of overall consumer investment and disinvestment in a local housing market. These data come from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's United States Postal Service Vacancy Database. The Postal Service collects and reports data on residential housing units that have been vacant (based upon mail delivery and forwarding data) for longer than 90 days.

Dissimilarity (Race)

Data Description:

The index of Dissimilarity is a demographic measure that examines the distribution or segregation of two groups across a geographic area. In the case of racial dissimilarity, presented here, the index score reflects the percentage of African-Americans within the county that would have to move from their current residential location in order to produce a geographic distribution similar to that of Caucasian residents within the county. The index of dissimilarity is calculated based upon Census Tract geographies. As such, a Dissimilarity Index score of .45 would indicate that 45% of African-Americans would have to move to a different Census Tract within the same county to achieve the same proportional distribution as Caucasians in the county.

The formula for the calculation of African-American racial dissimilarity is:

$$\frac{1}{2} \sum_{i=1}^N \left| \frac{b_i}{B} - \frac{w_i}{W} \right|$$

Where:

b_i = the African-American population of the i^{th} census tract

B = the total African-American population of the county

w_i = the white population of the i^{th} tract

W = the total white population of the county

Dissimilarity (Poverty)

Data Description:

The index of income dissimilarity examines the segregation of low-income households from their higher income counterparts in each county. In the case of income dissimilarity, presented here, the index score reflects the percentage of poverty households within the county that would have to move from their current residential location in order to produce a geographic distribution similar to that of non-poor households within the county. The index of dissimilarity is calculated based upon Census Tract geographies. As such, a Dissimilarity Index score of .25 would indicate

that 25% of households living below the poverty line would have to move to a different Census Tract within the same county to achieve the same proportional distribution as non-poor households in the county.

The formula for the calculation of poverty-wage dissimilarity is:

$$\frac{1}{2} \sum_{i=1}^N \left| \frac{b_i}{B} - \frac{w_i}{W} \right|$$

Where:

b_i = the below-poverty population of the i^{th} census tract

B = the total below-poverty population of the county

w_i = the above poverty population of the i^{th} tract
